

Services for Cecil Dean Evernham, 82, of 1721 Smead St., will be held at 10:30 a.m. Thursday in Fisher Funeral Chapel. He passed away at 6:15 p.m. Sunday, April 27, 2003, in Logansport Memorial Hospital.

Born June 10, 1920, in Buffalo, he was the son of Clarence Cecil and Daisy Henderson Evernham. He was married Sept. 8, 1939, in Monticello, to June B. Wyant, who died Feb. 10, 2003.

A graduate of Buffalo High School, Mr. Evernham was a veteran of the U.S. Army serving from Feb. 2, 1945, to Aug. 8, 1946, in the Pacific Theater and stationed in Japan during World War II.

He was active in the Past Matrons-Past Patrons Association.

Surviving are one son Donel Evernham, Logansport, and five grandchildren.

One daughter, Deana Jo Seidensticker, and three sisters preceded in death.

The Rev. Rick Jones, of First United Methodist Church, will officiate at the services. Burial will be in Ever-Rest Memorial Park.
