**Rev. Elmo Kellar**

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Galveston United Methodist Church for the Rev. Elmo Kellar, 88 a retired Methodist minister.

The Rev. Kellar died at 7:30 a.m. Sunday, April 17 in Marlon Veterans Hospital where he had been a patient there since November 30, 1965. He was born May 18, 1877, in Barton County, Kansas. His marriage was to Mary Ethel Merrell on October 4, 1899, and she died in November 1955.

He served with the 160th Infantry, Company L of Anderson, during the Spanish-American War and was a graduate of the class of 1897 of Kokomo High School. He was a member of the Upland Methodist Church, and also belonged to the VFW and the United Spanish War Veterans.

Survivors include two daughters, Mrs. Margaret Elizabeth Kellar, Providence, R. I., Mrs. D. V. (Mildred) Whitenak, Delta, Ohio; two sons, Edward Kellar, Titusville, Florida, James Kellar, National City, California; eight grandchildren and 17 great-grandchildren.
