

Patrick J. Campbell

Services for Patrick J. Campbell, 69, of Logansport, died at 10 a.m. Monday in Kroeger Funeral Home.

He died at 10:21 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 2, 2005, in St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Hospital, Kokomo.

Born March 18, 1935, in Logansport, he was the son of Elmer and Gertrude Crane Campbell. He was married June 23, 1999, in Las Vegas, Nev., to Cindy Peterson, who survives in Logansport.

Mr. Campbell was a disabled veteran of the U.S. Air Force. He served in the Korean War.

He was a member of the American Legion Post 60, Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 3790 and the Disabled American Veterans. He also was a member of the Logansport Eagles.

Mr. Campbell resided in California in the 1970s, where he was a member of the Screen Actors Guild. He appeared in the feature film "Honky Tonk Freeway" as well as in television productions of "The Rockford Files," "Hart to Hart," and "Gunsmoke." He was one of the seven original "Marlboro Men."

Mr. Campbell also worked as a private investigator.

He enjoyed playing pool and watching birds.

Also surviving are one son, Frasier Campbell and his wife, My Chau, Moore Park, Calif.; two daughters, Claire Raff and her husband, Jim, Woodland Hills, Calif., and Corinna Steele and her husband, Rob, California; one stepson, Matthew Paterson, Logansport; grandchildren, My An, My Vy, My Lyn, Anastasia, Nathaniel, Triston, Cameron and Landon; one great-grandchild; father-in-law and mother-in-law, Ron and Rose Peterson, Logansport; several nieces and nephews; several great-nieces and great-nephews; several sisters-in-law; and several brothers-in-law.

Two brothers, Robert E. "Humpy" Campbell and William Campbell, and one sister, infant Mary Alice Campbell, preceded in death.
