

Raymond L. Morgan

Services for Raymond L. Morgan, 79, Logansport, will be held at 2 p.m. Thursday in Kroeger Funeral Home.

He died at 8:10 p.m. Monday, Nov. 3, 2003, in Logansport Memorial Hospital.

Born March 9, 1924, in Logansport, he was the son of Henry and Stella Wilson Morgan. He was married Sept. 11, 1943, in Logansport, to Dora Arbella Ault, who survives.

A veteran of the U.S. Army, Mr. Morgan served in World War II in the air corps and later in the infantry. He had served in the battles of Normandy, Northern France, Rhineland and Central Europe. He was a recipient of EAME Theater Ribbon with four Bronze Stars, the Good Conduct Medal and the World War II Victory Medal.

He had been employed at Rockwell International, Logansport, for 32 years until his retirement in 1983.

He was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post #3790.

Also surviving are two sons, Jack L. Morgan and his wife, Lois, and Terry W. Morgan and his wife, Pat, all of Logansport; one half brother, Thomas Evers, Camden; two half sisters, Corabelle Harmon, Galveston, and Betty Jo Trainer and her husband, Jarvis, Logansport; four granddaughters; one stepgranddaughter; two great-grandsons; one great-granddaughter; one stepgreat-granddaughter; one stepgreat-grandson; and several nieces and nephews.

One son, Michael Raymond Morgan, preceded in death.

The Rev. Art Maloney will officiate at the services. Burial, with military graveside rites, will be in Mount Hope Cemetery.
