





Robert Spahr - County judge dies from cancer

After about four years of service, Miami County Circuit Court Judge Robert Spahr, 66, has died due to health complications from cancer. Spahr was diagnosed with cancer about a month ago, and went through chemotherapy, but the treatment was discontinued about a week ago. "We appreciate all the prayers and kind wishes people have given to us over the last month," said son Tim Spahr. "People have been very generous to our family. The kind sentiments, the prayers – it's just been very helpful, the outpouring.

"My father received so many cards, so many letters, so many photo albums. It helped him. You know it's a tough thing to get diagnosed with cancer, especially when it's advanced," he continued. "People just were really kind, and that's why I'm glad I live in a community like Peru. People pull together and support each other, and I know my dad loved living in Peru and the people in it. One of the things that really was troubling him, it was very troubling to him the idea that he wouldn't be able to finish his term as judge. He really wanted to fulfill his responsibility to the community."



The loss has been surreal for the Spahr family, the son noted, as the judge has been a figure of strength for the family.

"I think every family has someone everyone looks to as a source of strength and guidance, and he certainly filled that role for us," Tim Spahr said.

Spahr, originally from Indianapolis, graduated from Indiana University Bloomington with an undergraduate degree before going on to attend law school and pass the bar exam in 1974. He practiced law with Karl Jacobs in Fowler, Benton County, from 1974 to 1979 before moving to Miami County in June of 1979.

In a past interview with the Tribune, he joked that he decided to practice law after his mother suggested it, because he argued a lot. Spahr practiced law in Miami County for 20 years, including work for the Department of Child Services and as a private attorney. His sons, Tim and Tony Spahr, followed in his footsteps by starting their own law office in Peru.

Aside from law work, Spahr served in the U.S. Army for almost three years, which included service in Vietnam. The judge was also active in the community, attending and speaking at Miami County Tea Party meetings, organizing annual patriotic Flag Day events and doing public readings from his self-published works. Spahr wrote seven books for two series, "The Adventures of Torto" and "Abalaster City Flawed". Spahr was a member of the Peru Rotary, the Main Street United Methodist Church and a member of the church's choir. Spahr had been out of the courtroom since early August, with the courts arranging to bring interim judges to sit in for circuit court cases, some of which have been postponed. "Because the office is vacated, it goes to the governor for appointment ... It's a guesstimate, but the process will probably take at least 60 days," county attorney Pat Roberts said. The governor's office usually takes applications, conducts interviews with a committee, then appoints a

judge, according to Roberts. Miami County Commissioners chose to put the county courthouse flag at half-staff in mourning of the judge until the time of his funeral service.

"Bob was an asset to the community," commented Miami County Commissioners Chairman Craig Boyer, who added the judge's community involvement was excellent and that he felt the judge and his wife, Nancy, had an especially strong bond. Visitation is from 2-8 p.m. on Friday at the Main Street United Methodist Church, 81 West Main Street, Peru. A Memorial is

planned for 10:30 a.m. on Saturday with Rev. David Scifres officiating.

Maggie Schram - Oldest woman in Miami county dies: Newspaper Obituary and Death Notice Peru Tribune, The (IN) - Monday, November 12, 2012

Maggie Schram was alive when things were a lot harder and a lot simpler all at the same time and she would have celebrated 105 years on Tuesday. She was reported to be the oldest resident of Miami County. Schram was a resident at Caring Hands in Peru and her granddaughter, Lanette Combs, and her siblings and cousins can recount dozens of stories "Grandma Maggie" told of when she was just a girl. Schram was born several months prematurely in Hardin County, Kentucky, on November 13, 1907 — a time in history when there was next to no medical care. Her parents were James and Nancy Martin. "Her mother was determined to keep her alive that first winter, so she kept her tied in a sling under her shirt to keep her warm and fed," Combs explained. Her father worked for the Peru circus. A blacksmith by trade, Martin shoed the horses and he also fed and took care of the circus animals. Schram and her husband Walter were married in 1925 and purchased a house on West Fifth Street in Peru. It's the only home they ever owned. They built a cabin on Nyona Lake during their honeymoon in 1925, and lived in a tent while they built it. They sold the cabin during World War II when the gasoline rationing started. "She told of times when Peru was a thriving community — much bigger than Kokomo," Combs said. "Kokomo didn't have the industry then that they have now. There was a railway in Peru that people would use to get around town."

During the depression money may have been hard to come by but the family didn't go cold or hungry. They had a coal stove in the living room and a laundry stove – a small, boxy stove – in the kitchen. The family made toast on the laundry stove every morning for breakfast and fried potatoes every night for supper. "Hoboes (homeless folks who would hop the railway and ride from town to town) would come around looking for something to eat and Grandma Maggie would always find something for them," Combs said. Grandma Maggie worked for Wackerles Greenhouse, on the east side of Peru, Bryan Steam and later for Gallahan Oil. She had lots of homemade remedies – like making cough syrup. Schram would chop onions and put sugar on top of it, and then let the mixture sit in the window sill for a while. Then whoever had the cough would drink the juice. It helped the croup, Grandma Maggie said. When asked what she attributed to her long life, Schram said she "has never been one to worry." Walter Schram passed away in 1993 at the age of 90. The couple had four children – Russell (Gene) Schram, Shirley Gahs, the late Katie Myers and Jack Schram – plus 11 grandchildren, 20 great-grandchildren and 16 great-great-grandchildren.
